Syllabus: Introduction to Musical Concepts MUS 1P, Spring 2016

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a study and discussion of music and its aesthetic and creative applications in a multicultural civilization.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: To give the student a better understanding of music though the study of its basic elements, its history, and the development of a method of analytical listening.

COURSE CONTENT: Course content can be divided into four main areas: 1) an introduction to music fundamentals including notation, style and style recognition, form, melody, rhythm, texture, harmony and timbre; 2) development and application of a method of analytical listening which will lead to more musical awareness; 3) an introduction to Western Art music from Medieval to the present with an emphasis on the forms found in this style; 4) development of a perspective on creating music through the use of loop-based composition software. Content may also include an overview of the popular music of the past fifty years and discussion of music's role in society with an emphasis on contemporary popular culture (e.g. "Why people listen to music", "Why are people attracted to a certain style of music").

INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES: Selected readings from the textbook and the textbook's online StudySpace; lectures, discussions and demonstrations; three exams (including final), two analytical listening assignments, and StudySpace quizzes and listening activities.

GRADING: The final grade will be computed from the results of three exams (15%, 15%, 20% of grade), two Intelligent Listening assignments (10%, 20% of grade), and StudySpace Quizzes and Listening Activities (20% of grade). Good attendance and completing extra online practice analyses may be factored into the student's final grade.

ATTENDANCE: Will be taken every class and lab and will follow P.A.S. Program rules. A student cannot miss more than six sessions whether excused or unexcused. If this occurs, the student may be asked to withdraw from the course. Note: classes and labs are counted separately. Attendance will be factored into the student's final grade.

Again, *make sure the instructor email address you enter is correct so your work is recorded*. **NB**: *do the Listening Activity*, not the Listening Quiz for the chapter.
- 5. Try to visit other links on the chapter's Study Plan. The more you read and review on the Study Plan the better you will understand the topic which the chapter covers.
- 6. Visit your Norton GradeBook page often to make sure the work you have done has been recorded in the system. Occasionally progress reports on work reported as completed in StudySpace will be shared with the class.
